This course list provides a calendar of the teaching portfolio of the ANU Department of Pacific Affairs (DPA), which covers the depth and breadth of the current political, social, development and security landscape facing Australia and the Pacific region.

Established in 1996 and funded in partnership by ANU and the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT), DPA (formerly the State, Society and Governance in Melanesia Program) is the leading international centre for applied multidisciplinary research on issues of governance, state and society in the Pacific. Situated with the Coral Bell of Asia Pacific Affairs, DPA seeks to set the international standard for scholarship on the region. DPA undertakes a comprehensive suite of research, education and outreach activities, exemplifying the ANU's strategic vision of uniting scholarly excellence with contributions that make an impact on public policy-making in an area of high national importance. Programs and courses offered by the Department of Pacific Affairs are designed to facilitate broader and deeper education on the Pacific region amongst policymakers, program designers, researchers, analysts and others who want to focus on the region.

- ➤ If you want to build a foundation in Pacific Studies, enrol in the *Bachelor of Pacific Studies* (3 years). If you are an existing ANU undergraduate student, enrol in a Pacific undergraduate course as listed below.
- If you are looking to develop a comprehensive understanding of the Pacific, enrol in the Master of Pacific Development (48 units, 2 years). If you are an existing ANU postgraduate student, enrol in a Pacific postgraduate course as listed overleaf.
- ➤ If you are looking to deepen your understanding of the Pacific. enrol in *the Graduate Certificate of Pacific Development* (24 units, 6-12 months). For students enrolling in graduate certificates in 2021, ANU is offering reduced tuition fees.
- ➤ If you are interested in a stand-alone masterclass in Pacific politics, security and development, enrol in one of DPA's 25 *Microcredentials* (1-2 day intensive course) and build up credits for a future ANU postgraduate degree listed overleaf.
- If you want to pursue further research on the Pacific, enrol in the DPA PhD program.

What are microcredentials?

Building on DPA's existing course offerings, DPA has drawn on its research portfolio and teaching staff to develop a suite of microcredentials which offer:

- > deep-dives into a specific subject area, informed by the latest research from DPA and ANU.
- intensive teaching format to suit professional workloads, across 1, 2 or 5 teaching days, scheduled outside of school holidays.
- > accessibility and equity: participants with either a Bachelor degree or equivalent work-related experience (five years or more) will be eligible to enrol.
- > job-relevant assessment methods: assessment methods are designed to foster critical awareness with an emphasis on building an evidence-base for policy work.
- transferability: participants will accumulate credits for an ANU postgraduate degree such as the Master and Graduate Certificate in Pacific Development as well as other ANU offerings such as the Masters in Political Science; Public Policy; Environmental Management and Development; Applied Anthropology and Participatory Development.
